

Vestry Report

Holy Trinity

- The refurbishments to the Church Hall toilets and other associated work should commence week beginning 15th April and will last for 3-4 months (approx.).
- It is anticipated that repairs to the organ will commence in the near future.

• Repairs to the flat roofs at St. Patrick's Church Hall should commence shortly.

Other items

- The 10th September 2019 marks the 200th anniversary of Joseph Scriven's birth. A service is planned for Sunday 15th September at 6:30pm in Holy Trinity Church, to mark this anniversary. Joseph was born in Banbridge. He emigrated to Canada soon after the death of his fiancée, who drowned in 1843, on the night before they were to be married. In the mid-1850s he received news that his mother was seriously ill, he wrote a poem to comfort her. Later, the words of the poem were set to music, and became the well-known hymn 'What a friend we have in Jesus'. A stained-glass window, in Holy Trinity Church, is dedicated to the memory of Joseph Scriven.

All parishioners are invited to this meeting which provides an opportunity to hear reports about Parish life, including parish finances and to elect members to the Select Vestry for the coming year. Please pray for wisdom and guidance for all involved.

From the Rector...

It was an amazing day, which began with a service in Saul, where Eddie Lyle of Open Doors, spoke about the persecution Christians experience in various parts of the world, and their deep desire and determination to be faithful followers of Christ. Later, at the service in Down Cathedral, 'Michael Jones' an Egyptian Christian, also spoke about the challenges Christians in Egypt experience, and their deep desire and determination to be faithful followers of Christ.

During the service in Down Cathedral, Bishop Harold referred to the new St Patrick's Cross, which was erected last year at the Cathedral. He spoke about the hand imprint on the base of the cross, where people are encouraged to place their hand and pray. The Bishop encouraged people at the service to go to the cross, place their hand on the imprint and pray.

As we were leaving the Cathedral, we were given a card depicting the cross, with the following inscription; 'I commit myself to follow the way of Christ, no matter what the cost.' That's a commitment many persecuted Christians have made. However, being a follower of Jesus can be challenging, no matter where we live. Choose to be a committed follower of Jesus, faithful to the word of God and the will of God, and faithful to the plans and purposes of God.

As we approach Palm Sunday and Good Friday, we are reminded of Jesus' faithfulness to the Father's will. Jesus rode into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, knowing he was going to be arrested, tried, condemned and crucified. Even in the Garden of Gethsemane, just before His arrest, He prayed, 'Father, let this cup pass from me; yet not my will, but yours be done.'



Jesus, the sinless Son of God, died on the cross to pay the penalty for our sin, my sin, your sin, other people's sin. Forgiveness of sin is now available to those who repent of their sin and put their faith and trust in Jesus as their Saviour and Lord.

Earlier, I referred to the inscription on the card, please join with me in that prayer of commitment. I commit myself to follow the way of Christ, no matter what the cost.'

Having made this commitment to Jesus Christ, ask the Holy Spirit to help you live it out in daily life.
