From the Rector...

A man saw the car as it pulled unto the hard shoulder at the side of the dual carriageway. One of the tyres was flat. He wasn't going to stop and help, but as he drove past, he noticed the elderly couple in the car. On the spur of the moment, he decided he could spare a few minutes. He pulled in and went back to them. They were so glad to accept his offer to change the wheel. They thanked him profusely, when the job was done.

The woman was distraught because she had lost her engagement ring. She had an idea where it might have slipped off her finger. Thankfully, someone had noticed it, picked it up and kept it safe. The person who found the ring told some other people about it. Subsequently, one of the people who knew about him finding the ring, was talking to the woman who had lost the ring. A phone call was made, a picture of the ring was texted. It was the missing ring, within a short time the engagement ring was back on the woman's finger.

In these stories, the elderly couple were saved from the hassle of trying to change the wheel themselves or waiting for someone to come and help them; and the woman was saved from the anguish of having lost her engagement ring.

The Christmas story tells us about the birth of the Saviour, the coming of the Son of God into the world. When the angel appeared to Joseph in a dream, he told him to marry Mary, even though she was pregnant - because the baby was conceived through the power of the Holy Spirit. The angel told Joseph that Mary would give birth to a son, that he was to give him the name Jesus, because he will save His people from their sins.

He didn't save us by coming into the world, but the shadow of the cross was there from the very beginning. Jesus revealed God's character and nature during His earthly life and ministry, but it was through His death and resurrection that He has made it possible for us and others to be saved from our sin - to know a restored relationship with God when we put our faith and trust in Jesus as our Saviour.

As we celebrate His birth, remember why He came. He came to save us! Be sure you have accepted what He has made available, and live for Him with gratitude and thankfulness.





Vestry Report

Holy Trinity Church - As reported in last month's magazine, it is anticipated that repairs to the organ will recommence in January 2019. Repairs have begun to the windows broken during the recent break-in; the cost of this work will be met by our insurance company. A sensor light at the disabled access door has been installed.

Holy Trinity Church Hall - A contractor has been appointed to carry out the work at the Church Hall to upgrade the toilets and do other minor works. This work is being funded by a grant from the SIF (Social Investment Fund). It is anticipated that the work will begin in January.

It was agreed to upgrade the controls for the heating system in the Church Hall. It is hoped that this work will commence early in 2019.

St Patrick's Church - The pew cushions have been repaired and the Select Vestry would like to thank Esther Hammond from the Knitting & Crotchet club for all her help.

St Patrick's Church Hall - It is anticipated that work to repair the flat roof at the front entrance end of St Patrick's Church Hall will begin shortly; once this problem is addressed, the interior wall can be repainted.


Banbridge Community Foodbank




