From the Rector...

What's in a name? Choosing a name can be a daunting process, as parents try to decide on a name for their baby, a name that normally stays with the child for the rest of his/her life.

Prospective parents often spend hours thinking about and discussing what they are going to call their baby. They may buy books with the names and the meaning of names or do online searches for possible names. They may consider calling their baby after a relative, a friend or even a celebrity. Sometimes, there aren't the hours of discussion and debate because the parents agree on a name that seems to be just right.

Mary and Joseph didn't have to deliberate and discuss the name they were going to give Mary's baby. When God sent the angel Gabriel to Mary at Nazareth, he told her that she had found favour with God and that she was going to become pregnant through the power of the Holy Spirit. Gabriel also told Mary that she was to give him the name Jesus.

An angel of the Lord also appeared to Joseph in a dream. He told him not to be afraid to take Mary home as his wife, because the child had been conceived through the power of the Holy Spirit. The angel also told him that the child was to be called Jesus.

Mary was told to call him Jesus, Joseph was told to call him Jesus. They didn't need to discuss or debate, they chose to name the child, Jesus.

What's in a name? They were to give Him the name Jesus, because He will save His people from their sins. Through His crucifixion, death and resurrection Jesus did make it possible for people to be saved from their sins, when they repent of their sin and put their trust in Jesus as their Saviour, friend and Lord.

The birth of Jesus was the fulfilment of the prophecy of Isaiah, 'The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Emmanuel.' What's in a name? Emmanuel means God with us.

What's in a name? 'You are to give Him the name Jesus, because He will save His people from their sins.' 'They will call him Emmanuel, which means 'God with us.'

As we celebrate the coming of the Son of God into the world, let us remember that God wants to be intimately involved in our lives. He wants us to respond to His love, to trust in Jesus as our Saviour, He wants us to know Him, to

listen to His voice and follow Him and to live for Him in the power of the Holy Spirit.

May you truly know God as Emmanuel – God with you!
