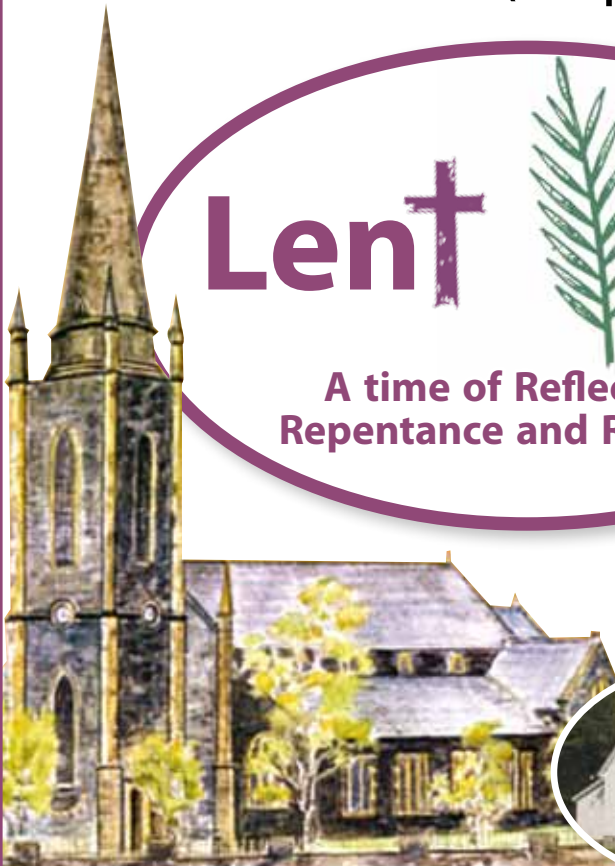

From the Rector...

Greetings in the name of Christ

Chocolate, coffee, chips, cookies, coke, crisps, cake, cheese, chicken and cigarettes - these are ten things beginning with the letter 'c' which a variety of people have considered giving up for Lent. Some people 'religiously' give up something for Lent every year, some think about it and for some Lent is a non-event.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday - 18th February and continues to Easter. There are forty days in Lent, not counting Sundays. The word 'Lent' comes from an Old English word linked to spring. Lent isn't mentioned in the Bible, but it is a tradition that has been kept from the time of the early Church.

Giving up things in Lent or doing things in Lent isn't about trying to earn God's favour. If we think of it in that way we are probably approaching it from the wrong perspective; it is better to think of it as a time to prepare to 'celebrate' Good Friday and Easter.

In reality, whether we decide to give up something for Lent is less important than deciding to use Lent as a time to develop or further develop our relationship with God. Developing our relationship with God, developing intimacy with God won't just happen; it's something that we have to do intentionally - just like any other relationship.

I encourage you to think about what you are going to do during Lent to develop your relationship with God.

Year of Mission - an exciting start

Like other parishes throughout the Diocese of Down and Dromore we officially launched the Year of Mission at our services on Sunday 4th January. Those who were present joined together in praying a Covenant Prayer and were given a commitment card which they could sign and keep as a reminder of our focus during the year.

The words on the Commitment Card are:

In this Year of Mission 2015, I willingly take my place within the welcoming, worshipping and witnessing life of this Church as we commit to reaching beyond our walls with the good news of Jesus Christ.



There are still some Commitment Cards and copies of the Covenant Prayer available in the Church.

We followed our morning services with a lunch. This was very well supported with over 150 parishioners attending. It was great to come together for a family lunch and show our commitment to our Church and each other. The feedback from the day has been extremely positive and encouraging.

The weather was kind to us, cold but the day stayed dry – this was greatly appreciated by all, especially the barbeque team who braved the temperature to expertly cook the burgers and hot dogs. The kitchen was also a hive of activity, with an army of willing volunteers preparing delicious soups, bread and desserts.

A massive, 'Thank You' to all who helped make our time together so enjoyable – those who donated, prepared and served the food, set up and cleared the Hall and to all those who attended.

End-of-Year Financial Update

Ministry and mission could not continue and develop in the Parish without the financial support of parishioners. So a big **thank you** to each person and family who contributed financially to the mission and ministry of the parish in 2014. Thank you for your continued generous support; your giving makes a real difference to what we can do as a local Church - a Church that is seeking to 'Grow in God's Love and Share it with Others.'

Although the figures for 2014 still have to be finalised our giving through weekly envelopes, standing orders and loose collections was £184,000 approx. This is an increase of approximately £9,000 on the 2013 figure. In addition to this, the Building Repair Fund has realised £12,000 approx. Thank you to all who give.

It is great to see our income increasing and we thank all who contribute, but our income is still less than our expenditure. Parishioners will realise that we cannot continue in a situation where our income is less than our expenditure, so we ask all parishioners to give generously, as we seek to continue to develop the ministry and mission of the church.

Register of Vestry Members

The Register of General Vestry Members will be **reviewed at the meeting of the Select Vestry on 17th February 2015**. Registration/Declaration Forms for those who wish to be included in the Register of Vestry Members are available on request from the Rector and Churchwardens for one calendar month before the date of the meeting.

The Registration/Declaration Forms must be completed and signed by those who wish to apply to register for the first time or those who wish to be replaced on the register, and submitted to the Rector or the churchwardens **before the Vestry Meeting on 17th February**.

Any person registered or claiming to be registered, either as a resident or accustomed member, must subscribe to Church/Parish funds. Subscriptions must be contributed in such a manner that a receipt could be demanded for them. At the Review Meeting in February, the Select Vestry will receive the Forms of Declaration. If there are no objections, the names of all qualified persons who have completed Forms of Declaration shall be added to the Register. The names of those who are no longer qualified (that is those who have left the Parish or those who no longer subscribe in the 'approved' manner) will be removed from the Register.
