#### **God's New Year's Honours List**

We are all familiar with the Queen's New Year's honours list, celebrating those who have made a significant contribution to public life. What would God's New Year's honours list look like? In 1 Sam. 2:30 God says, 'Those who honour me I will honour'. In this New Year, how can we honour God in our lives?

Honouring God means giving Him reverence, submission, and obedience; the complete surrender of our entire lives to His glory and loving service: 'in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God – this is your true and proper worship.' (Romans 12:1). So, we might honour God this year in five key areas:

My Time: how can I use my time to glorify God (Colossians 4:5)? My Gifts: how am I using my God-given gifts and abilities in His service (Matthew 25:14-30)? My Body: in what ways do I honour God in my body (1 Corinthians 6:18-20)? My Treasure: who is in charge of my finances (Matthew 6:24)? My Heart: how do I honour God not just outwardly, but from my heart: 'These people come near to me with their mouth and honour me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me' (Isaiah 29:13)?

Here's a challenge for 2018: When we wake up each day, let's ask God: 'How can I honour you today? Please help me to honour you with the time, gifts, body, finance, and heart that you have given me.' Jesus Christ gave His life for us, and promises to give us the Holy Spirit to help us to serve Him. 'When the worship is over, let the service begin.'

### From the Rector...

I'm dreaming of a white Christmas' was written by Irving Berlin in 1942. The version sung by Bing Crosby is believed to be the world's best-selling single, with estimated sales of over 100 million copies worldwide. The song originally featured in the film 'Holiday Inn'. The words of the song struck a chord with the soldiers fighting in Second World War and their families who were waiting for them back home.

I'm writing this letter in the middle of December, so I don't know if we'll have a white Christmas, but I do know that we had snow a few days ago. Although, snow can cause problems on the roads etc., there is something amazing about looking at a landscape covered in a blanket of white, without a mark or blemish to be seen.

Snow is mentioned on a number of occasions in the Bible. In Isaiah 1:18 we read, 'Come now, let us reason together, says the Lord: even though your sins are like scarlet (bright red), they shall be as white as snow; and even though they are red like crimson (dark red), they shall become like wool.'

These words were spoken to the people of Israel, when God was urging them to consider what they were doing, how they were living and how they were responding to Him. The end of one year and the beginning of another year is an opportune time for us to do the same – to consider what we are doing, how we are living and how we are responding to God.

Jesus Christ, the Son of God, who came to earth, is also the One who suffered and died on the cross and was raised to life again to buy the pardon and release of anyone and everyone who repents of their sin and puts their trust in Jesus as their Saviour and Lord. As a consequence of His crucifixion, death and resurrection it's possible for sin, which is like scarlet, to be made as white as snow.

# White as Snow?

It's possible for us to make a fresh start, to know forgiveness for our sin, to enter into a restored relationship with God and to know peace with God.

So, as we come to the end of one year and enter a new one, may you recognise Jesus Christ as the One who died and was raised to life again to save you. May you trust in Him as your Saviour and Lord, may your faith in God and your relationship with God grow and flourish, may your commitment to Christ be unwavering and may your know the empowering presence of the Holy Spirit as you live for the Lord, as you seek to faithful to the teaching of the Bible and fulfil His will.

#### **Register of Vestry Members**

The Register of General Vestry Members will be reviewed at the meeting of the Select Vestry on Tuesday 20th February. Registration/Declaration Forms for those who wish to be included in the Register of Vestry Members will be available on request from the Rector and Churchwardens for one calendar month before the date of the meeting.

The Registration/Declaration Forms must be completed and signed by those who wish to apply to register for the first time or those who wish to be replaced on the Register, and submitted to the Rector or the churchwardens before the Vestry Meeting on Tuesday 20th February.

Any person registered or claiming to be registered, either as a resident or accustomed member, must subscribe to Church/Parish funds. Subscriptions must be contributed in such a manner that a receipt could be requested for them. At the Review Meeting in February the Select Vestry will receive the Forms of Declaration. If there are no objections, the names of all qualified persons who have completed Forms of Declaration shall be added to the Register.

The names of those who are no longer qualified (that is those who have left the Parish or those who no longer subscribe in the 'approved' manner) will be removed from the Register.



#### **Epiphany – 6th January**

On 6th January we celebrate Epiphany - the visit of the wise men to the baby Jesus.

Matthew 2 tells us that the Magi asked Herod: 'Where is the One who has been born king of the Jews? We saw His star in the east and have come to worship Him.' Matthew also tells us about their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Gold is thought to be a gift suitable to be given to a king. Frankincense was used in the worship of God at the Temple. Myrrh was a spice used in preparing bodies for burial.

Their gifts honoured Jesus with gold because He was a King, with frankincense because He was to be worshipped as divine; and with myrrh, because He would also become a sacrifice and die for His people.

The Wise Men travelled for months over difficult terrain, they never saw any evidence of Jesus' kingship, His divinity or His sacrificial death. They worshipped Him through faith in God's promises about Him. Isaiah foresaw this response to Jesus: 'Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn.'

Compare the Wise Men with the High Priest and religious leaders whom the Wise Men saw in Jerusalem when they first arrived. These priests knew about the prophecies of their own coming Messiah, but not one of the Jewish religious leaders travelled to look for Him in Bethlehem. And it's only six miles down the road!

Take time to worship, make time to worship! May our worship of God be intentional and real.






