From the Rector...

My optician tells me that I don't take enough care of my glasses, probably with some justification. Part of the problem is that I don't always put them in the case, but put them in the pocket of my shirt. As a consequence of this, sometimes when I bend over to pick something up or when I'm doing practical jobs, my glasses fall out of my pocket. Often, they land on the ground with the lens down. Other problems have included the leg of my glasses coming off just when I was about to begin a service. And of course, like most people who have glasses, occasionally there have been times when I've forgotten them or can't find them.

Many of us are aware of the phrase '20/20 vision', but may not know what it means. The term 20/20 vision is an expression of our ability to see at a distance. The first number is the distance from the letters on the screen and the second number indicates the letter size a person can read.

According to google, only 35% of people have 20/20 vision without glasses or contact lenses, but with the help of glasses or contact lenses the percentage goes up to about 75%. Having 20/20 vision does not mean that a person has perfect vision, other things must be considered as well, including peripheral awareness, the ability to focus and colour vision.

You may be wondering why I'm writing about glasses, eyesight and 20/20 vision and the reason is simple, we are about to enter 2020. I believe that the beginning of 2020 is an opportune time to take stock, to take a fresh look at our lives, our relationship with God, our commitment to Christ and His Church; an opportune time to take a fresh look at our prayer life, our reading



of the Bible and applying its teaching in our daily life, the regularity of our attendance at worship and our involvement in the ministry and mission of the Church, and the amount of our giving to support the ministry and mission of the Church and further the work of the Kingdom of God. Please do consider these things and ask God to guide you and help you to develop your relationship with Him.

The beginning of 2020 is also an opportune time to consider our commitment to the Parish Mission Statement – 'Growing in God's Love and Sharing it with Others' and to living out our strapline – 'Being Church at the heart of Banbridge and Seapatrick'.

As you read through this magazine you will discover a number of initiatives to help us take stock, to take a fresh look, to stir our desire to have a more meaningful relationship with God and our willingness to live for Him and fulfil His will. These include, 'Five Minutes for Five Days', 'Read The Word | BIBLE 2020', 'A Fresh Look | Alpha 2020' and of course there are the Church Services, Connect Groups, our Youth and Children's activities and initiatives, and so much more.

Lord open our eyes so that we see you more clearly, our minds so that we hear you more plainly, our hearts so that we love you more dearly and our lives so that we follow you more nearly.

2020 – A new year, offering all kinds of opportunities, challenges and goals. If you fancy a new opportunity, support with your challenges or encouragement with your goals, then CAP Life Skills may be just the place for you (or someone you know).

Life Skills is a free 8 week course that brings people together to learn about:

- · Dealing with the pressure to spend
- Deciding where our money should be going
- Spotting a good deal
- Improving relationships
- Cooking economical, healthy meals

Tips shared in our Life Skills group cover ways of improving health, including understanding of food groups and shopping for supermarket bargains. We find that, on these courses, we have as much fun sharing ideas as learning from each other. We have many great conversations and share some brilliant techniques which can give each of us a head start when we're dealing with life's pressures. We know that people who have felt alone, not knowing where to turn, have found that Life Skills can give them practical, emotional help.
