From the Rector...

In the middle of February, I realised it was time to decide where I'm going to stay during the General Synod meeting in Dublin, at the beginning of May. I'd spoken to other synod representatives a number of weeks ago, but despite those initial conversations, no decisions were taken and no booking was made. The first part of my preparation for the Synod has now been completed, a room has been booked.

I think the next part of my preparation for going to the Synod will be the diocesan meeting for synod representatives at the end of February. Later on, it will be reading the literature that we'll receive prior to the Synod, and then the final part of the preparations will be deciding what clothes to bring with me when I go to the Synod.

Preparing for things is part of life, we prepare for going to school or to work, for exams and assignments, for activities and events, for celebrations and parties, for outings and holidays. The outcomes can be disappointing if we don't make adequate preparation.

Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday, is a time of preparation as we look forward to Good Friday and Easter. Lent isn't mentioned in the Bible, but the forty days of Lent remind us of the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness, before He began his public ministry. Jesus fasted and prayed while he was in the wilderness, it was a time with God preparing for His ministry, a ministry that He knew would ultimately take Him to the cross.

Some people think about giving up certain things in Lent, but Lent is not simply about giving up certain things. Lent is a time for thought as we consider the A Time of Preparation

things that draw our attention away from God. Lent is a time for reflection, repentance and renewal; a time to develop and deepen our relationship with God.

The words of Psalm 139:23-24 may well be a good place to start.

Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.

Please make the time, during Lent, to pray regularly using these words. Let's recognise our need of God's grace and mercy, our need of God's forgiveness – a forgiveness that has been made possible because of Jesus' crucifixion, death and resurrection. As we recognise our need of forgiveness, may we also recognise our need to repent, which includes turning away from what we know is wrong and displeases and dishonours God. As we come to God, in repentance and faith may we know His renewing grace and power, and may our lives be transformed by the presence and power of the Holy Spirit.

When they couldn't get into the house because of a crowd of people who had gathered, they took their friend up unto the roof and after they had made a hole in the roof, they lowered him down in front of Jesus.

Zacchaeus seized the moment because he wanted to see Jesus, and his life was transformed by Jesus seeing him. Other people who seized the moment and came to Jesus included Nicodemus - a religious leader, a woman whose daughter was ill, a Roman Centurion, a rich ruler, and many others.

Join us on Wednesdays during Lent as we make the most of the opportunity to learn from those encounters where people seized the moment and came to Jesus.

An Invitation to be part of 20% in 2020

Thank you to everyone who has responded to the invitation to be part of a 20% increase in 2020. In the February magazine I shared how God convinced me that 20% in 2020 is to be a key theme and focus for us as a Church family this year. I believe that initially 20% in 2020 is about a 20% increase in Church attendance, a 20% increase in giving and a 20% increase in the time we spend reading the Bible and praying.

- to those who are helping us achieve a 20% increase in attendance by attending Church regularly and to those who have been and are inviting and encouraging others to join with us for worship
- to those who have increased their giving by 20% and to those people who have requested Weekly Envelopes or set up Standing Orders
- to those who have increased the time they spend reading the Bible and praying by 20%.

It's great that members of our Church family have responded positively to be part of 20% in 2020. However, it would make a tremendous difference to us individually, to our church family and to the community if everyone got involved.

As well as encouraging members of our church family to be part of

As well as encouraging members of our church family to be part of a 20% increase in 2020, I also want us to be part of a 20% decrease in 2020. When God created the world, human beings were given the responsibility of caring for the world and everything in it. However, global warming reminds us that we aren't good at using

the earth's resources wisely and responsibly and caring for the environment.

Individually and as a church family we can make a difference. During 2020 we are looking at ways to decrease our carbon footprint by 20%. By being more proactive, we will be fulfilling God's instruction to protect and care for the environment. (Genesis 2:15) We could be better at many things; recycling, reducing our use of single use plastic and reducing the amount of energy we use. Achieving this will involve expenditure, e.g. upgrading some lights to LED, which use considerably less electricity. However, this is a short-term investment for a long-term goal. A 20% increase in giving in 2020 will help fund some of these upgrades.

Although '20% in 2020' may be challenging, I believe it is what God is calling us to do, as we seek to serve Him and fulfil His will. Please be part of '20% in 2020'.

BIBLE 2020 | Read the Word

The readings for March are printed below, they are also available on card in Church, on the Church website and on a smart phone app which has been developed by the Bible Society. We'll read about God's promise of a coming king, Christ's declaration and explanation of the Kingdom, and culminating with a glimpse towards the day when the Kingdom of the world becomes the Kingdom of our Lord and of his Messiah, when he will reign for ever and ever.
