On Wednesday evenings in Lent we are focussing on places Jesus visited and the encounters people had with Him. So make the most of the opportunity.

From the Rector...

In recent years a significant number of houses and apartments have been built along the coast, and more continue to be built. Properties with sea views command premium prices. It appears that being near the coast is the desirable place to live.

How different it must have been years ago. If we go back a long way to the 5th century, to the time of Patrick, it appears that pirates and marauders often attacked coastal communities carrying off some of the inhabitants as slaves. Patrick's life changed dramatically when at the age of 16 he was captured by pirates and taken to Ireland; where he was made to work as a slave looking after sheep.

He started to think about his relationship with God. He repented of his sin and put his trust in Jesus as his Saviour. After his conversion Patrick spent much time in prayer, often getting up before dawn to spend time with God and praying frequently during the day.

After being in Ireland for six years Patrick heard a voice telling him to escape and go to the coast where a ship would take him back to his homeland. After his escape, he had a dream/vision which he believed was a call from God to return to Ireland to tell others about Jesus. Patrick responded to the call of God and returned to Ireland proclaiming the good news of the gospel and establishing Christian communities.

Responding To God's Call...

We celebrate St Patrick's Day on 17th March and then at the end of the month we remember another person who responded to the call of God on His life, some-one whose obedience to the call of God was far more significant and far reaching. That person was Jesus, the Son of God, who remained faithful to the Father's will throughout His earthly life. He rode into Jerusalem on a donkey, on the day we now call Palm Sunday, even though he knew what lay ahead of Him.


At the Passover Meal, on the Thursday evening, Jesus spoke to the disciples about His betrayal. Afterwards, in the Garden of Gethsemane, he prayed, 'Father, let this cup of suffering pass from me, yet not my will, but yours be done.' Shortly after this, He was arrested, went through a sham trial before the Jewish leaders, they declared He was guilty and deserved to die. Jesus was brought to Pilate, who said Jesus was innocent of the charges, and yet he condemned Jesus to death. Jesus was crucified, He died and was buried, and God raised Him to life again. As a result of his crucifixion, death and resurrection, salvation and a restored relationship with God is available to all who repent of their sin and put their trust in Jesus as their Saviour. All of that is available because Jesus responded to and fulfilled the call of God on His life.






Connect Groups


