From the Rector...

Remembrance Sunday takes on an added significance this year, as it marks the centenary of the ending of World War 1. In 1918 the guns fell silent at the eleventh hour, on the eleventh day, of the eleventh month.

The First World War began in August 1914. Tensions already existed between Serbia and Austria-Hungary because of recent wars and disagreements. Then Archduke Franz Ferdinand, heir to the throne of Austria-Hungary and his wife Sophie, were assassinated in Sarajevo on 28th June 1914. The Austria-Hungary government believed that Serbia had helped and supported the terrorists who carried out the assassination.

Ultimatums were issued, and when these weren't met, Austria-Hungary declared war on Serbia on 28th July. Within days, other countries became involved and by 4th August World War 1 had begun.

Lord Kitchener, who was secretary of state for war in the first years of World War 1, realised that the British Army was too small. He called for 200,000 men to sign up for the British army in the first month of the war - 300,000 men enlisted. The recruitment posters declared, 'Your Country Needs You!' and more people enlisted in the coming months, to serve King and country.



One hundred years later, we look back and remember with thanksgiving those who served, those who were killed, those who were injured, those who lived through the atrocities of World War 1. We acknowledge with gratitude the sacrifices people made in World War 1, in World War 2 and in other wars and conflicts so that we can enjoy freedom and liberty, but let's not take that freedom and liberty for granted and let's not see freedom and liberty as a licence to do whatever we want.

As we remember Lord Kitchener's call for people to serve 'King and Country', let's remember that there's a greater King who calls us to follow Him and be a member of His kingdom. Jesus Christ, the Son of God, who suffered and died on the cross and was raised to life again, calls us to follow Him, to serve Him and to live as His soldiers and servants.



Remembrance Day Services Sunday 11th November

At Holy Trinity the Act of Remembrance will begin at 10:50am (between the 2 morning services). Those attending the 9:45am service are asked to remain for the Act of Remembrance and those coming to the 11:15am service are asked to arrive at Church at 10:45am.

There will be a break after the Act of Remembrance, during which people who have attended the 9:45am service will have the opportunity to leave the Church, and those not attending the Act of Remembrance will be able to join us for the 11:15am service.

At St Patrick's, the Act of Remembrance will take place during the 10:00am Service.

Ringing out for Peace

On **11 November 2018**, the United Kingdom and its friends overseas will mark the day 100 years ago when the guns fell silent at the end of the First World War. At the end of the war bells rang out across the country to celebrate the coming of peace. To commemorate the centenary of the Armistice

which signalled the end of the First World War it has been requested that bells across the country and worldwide should ring at 12.30pm on 11th November. Holy Trinity Church will join in this tribute marking this historic occasion.

This will be a symbolic way to give thanks for the end of war 100 years ago and will replicate the national outpouring of relief that took place at the end of the war as news of the Armistice filtered through and bells which had long been silent rang out.

Bells ringing out at 12.30pm will help mark the shift in emphasis from Remembrance in the morning to thanksgiving in the afternoon for the end of war and for peace. This will coincide with the start of the People's Procession, as 10,000 members of the public march past the Cenotaph in a nation's thank you.

Exhibition to Commemorate the Armistice Centenary

As the various anniversaries to commemorate the Great War over the last four years draw to a close we look forward to our final Act of Remembrance in November. On the 11th hour, of the 11th day, of the 11th month in 1918 the guns finally fell silent



after four long years of war. Nearly one hundred years later, on Saturday 10th November Holy Trinity Parish Church will be open to visitors between 2.00pm and 6.00pm to mark this occasion.

There will be a small exhibition on those soldiers from the parish and greater Banbridge District who made the supreme sacrifice in the cause of freedom. The exhibition will feature individual pictures of some of the fallen, associated biographical information and some memorabilia from the period. There will also be a slide show on the overhead screens in the church showing a rolling memorial to these men. Our own local military historian, Tommy McClimonds, will be on hand and will do his best to answer any queries or help further with individual research.

Resilience

Thursday 29th November at 7:30pm | Holy Trinity Church Hall

For anyone who has the care of children/young people - parents, carers, youth leaders, teachers, family members but is primarily aimed at parents.

Resilience is **important** for a number of reasons; it enables us to develop mechanisms for protection against experiences which could be overwhelming, it helps us to maintain balance in our lives during difficult or stressful periods of time, and can also protect us from the development of some mental health problems.

On the 29th November at 7.30pm we are running an evening to explore the issues facing our young people and ways to support them to become more resilient as they face the challenges of growing up and living in society. If you want to understand better how to care for your young person then come along to this evening hosted by Mark Kernohan of Big House as we explore mental health issues, how to intervene, what to do and how to help our young people cope in difficult situations.

This interactive session will allow us to explore various coping mechanisms which may help young people, regardless of whatever difficulty they are facing. Together we will discover that healthy coping mechanisms (such as talking to someone we trust, seeking help) are better for us compared to unhealthy coping mechanisms (such as self-harm, isolation and eating disorders).

Vestry Report

Financial Situation - The Vestry received an update on the parish's income and expenditure. Parish income through Weekly Envelopes, Standing Orders and loose collections is similar to that of last year, but our expenditure has increased. Our expenditure is mainly on people, property – maintenance and upkeep, including utilities (heat, light etc.), and programmes – though some of our programmes and initiatives are funded by grants.

It was agreed to encourage parishioners to give generously, by way of Standing Orders or Weekly Envelopes. It was agreed to encourage parishioners who pay income tax to sign a Gift Aid Form, if they haven't already done so. (If you pay income tax, signing a Gift Aid Form means we can claim back 25p from HRMC for every £1 you give to Church, at no extra cost to you)

Please contact the Parish Office to set-up a Standing Order or request weekly envelopes.

Holy Trinity Church - The claim for the damage to the Church windows has been submitted to our insurance company. The repairs to the windows will be carried out when approval has been received.

The organ builder who is repairing and restoring the organ has indicated that although work has been done off site in preparation for the work on the organ, he will not be able to begin the work in the Church until the new year.

Holy Trinity Church Hall - The professional team who are dealing with the refurbishment of the toilets at the Church Hall, for which we are receiving a grant from the SIF (Social Investment Fund), have informed us that the tender documents have been assessed and it is hoped to appoint contractors in the coming weeks. The work at the Church Hall is one of a number of projects which is receiving funding from the Social Investment Fund.

St Patrick's Church Hall - It was agreed to get tenders to repair the flat roof at the front entrance end of St Patrick's Church Hall.

Bannview Heights - The Vestry agreed to upgrade the roof insulation in the curatage at Bannview Heights.

Painting railings at Holy Trinity and St Patrick's - Although people have signed up to help paint the railings, it was agreed to postpone this work until the spring of next year.




