

Launched almost fifty years ago, Bishops' Appeal has provided much needed funding and support to many countries where people are in desperate need. Its current emphasis is on rural development, health and education projects as well as responding, of course, to major disaster situations. Over the years, Bishops' Appeal has partnered with church mission agencies, NGOs (non-governmental organisation), dioceses and parishes, as well as with communities overseas, to encourage and enable support for particular projects focusing on sustainability issues such as removing the complex barriers to education or to food security.

None of this would be possible without the practical and prayerful support of dioceses, parishes and individuals across the Church of Ireland. From the Rector...

It was 100 years ago, on 11th November 1919, that the first Armistice Day (now Remembrance Day) was marked in the United Kingdom. King George V requested that the country pause in silence for two minutes, on the first anniversary of the ending of World War 1, to remember the members of the armed forces who lost their lives in the line of duty.

In 1920, the Cenotaph was erected temporarily in Whitehall for a peace parade on Armistice Day. Subsequently, the Cenotaph became a permanent structure, and in the following years war memorials were created in other cities and towns. Some Acts of Remembrance occur on 11th November and some people still observe the two-minute silence on that day; but since 1939, the main Acts of Remembrance are held on the Sunday nearest to 11th November

During World War 1 and World War 2 there were seven national days of prayer. One of those days of prayer was called by King George VI, when the British Army and soldiers of other Allied nations, found themselves with their backs to the sea and hemmed in by their enemies. The day of prayer took place on Sunday 26 May 1940, the King and members of the Cabinet, together with millions in all parts of the Nation, Commonwealth and Empire gathered in Cathedrals and Churches to join in prayer.

Prime Minister Winston Churchill stated at the time that maybe 20,000 to 30,000 might escape back to England from Dunkirk. In the event, by a series of 'miracles', over 300,000 were rescued. These miracles included a storm of such severity that German aeroplanes were unable to take to the sky; in contrast to this storm, the English Channel was calm, allowing a vast armada of little ships, big ships and warships, to accomplish such an amazing rescue.

After God rescued the People of Israel from slavery in Egypt, Moses spoke to them about God's commands just before they entered the Promised Land. God's command included these words from Deuteronomy 6:5, Deuteronomy 8:2a and Deuteronomy 8:6.

Love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your strength.

Remember how the Lord your God led you through the wilderness.

Obey the commands of the Lord your God by walking in his ways and revering Him.

Despite these commands the People of Israel failed to love God wholeheartedly, they forgot what God had done for them and they disobeyed Him. Sadly, it appears that many of the nations of the world, including our own, have forgotten God and forgotten His commands.

Please pray that the leaders and people of this and other nations will remember God and return to Him in repentance, that they will put their faith in Jesus Christ as their Saviour. He is the One who died and was raised to life again so that those who put their trust in Him can know forgiveness of sin and a restored relationship with God.

Pray that those who are followers of Jesus will obey God and fulfil His will in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Remember, Repent and Renew your relationship with God. Read and obey His Word, the Bible. Desire intimacy with Him, spend time with Him in prayer.



Read the Word

This month, we're reading Ezekiel together as a church family. It might be easy to be put off or confused by the details, but it is a book which reminds us constantly of God's faithfulness, justice, and mercy.

Ezekiel was among the exiles in Babylon when the heavens opened,



The book records visions of God's plans for the future, which bring hope in the present. Ezekiel teaches that Israel deserved God's judgement, but that God - in his mercy - has plans to redeem and restore His people. The exiles in Babylon are called to remain faithful to the Lord, trusting in His promise for the future. As visions of the glory of God are glimpsed, the Book of Ezekiel reminds God's people - then and now - to respond to God's goodness and grace in faith and to live lives of holiness.

In Holy Trinity, children go out halfway through the 11:15am service for Sunday Space.



Vestry Report

Holy Trinity

Financial Update

We are pleased to report that our income through Weekly Envelopes, Standing Orders and money on the collection plate has increased by over £4,000 compared to the same period last year. This increase is due to more parishioners contributing to parish funds through weekly envelopes and standing orders, and through increased giving by some parishioners.

We are so thankful for this increase in giving, but even with this increase we have a shortfall of £16,000 during the first half of this year. A number of factors have contributed to this shortfall, these include having two curates during the first part of the year and the cost of building repairs and maintenance.

Please help us reduce this deficit before the end of the year. We need the help of our whole church family. Please consider this request prayerfully and give as generously as possible; and remember every contribution makes a difference.

Nigeria now the 'largest killing ground for Christians in the world'

There are warnings that religious violence in Nigeria is spiralling out of control. The United Nations describes a 'pressure cooker of injustice'. And a leading US human rights campaigner fears Nigeria could be set to implode, destabilising surrounding countries.

UK-based Release International supports Christian victims of violence around the world. Its partners in Nigeria warn of an agenda of Islamisation. Archbishop Benjamin Kwashi says Fulani militia are being used to drive Christians out of the North.

In his new book, Neither Bomb Nor Bullet, (Lion Hudson) he writes: 'Nigeria is being described as the largest killing ground for Christians in the world today. First Boko Haram and now Fulani militants. The plan we see being executed is to wipe Christianity from the face of northern Nigeria.'

Please pray for all persecuted Christians including those in Nigeria.

He also helped lead an Exodus team to the Czech Republic, where they ran a camp tor children and teens in conjunction with Hands of Hope. This ministry aims to share the good news of Jesus to a vulnerable group of young people.

Niall McCarter

Niall McCarter was involved with CEF teams all summer, travelling to Cork, Killeel, Athlone, Annalong, Macedonia, and even Banbridge! As well as getting to share the Gospel with children and young people, the camps were also an opportunity for Niall to grow as a leader. He especially enjoyed getting to spend time with everyone who came to the camps, showing them God's love and enabling them to grow as disciples - and seeing how faithful God is in all circumstances.

Sophie MacFarlane

Sophie MacFarlane was in Spain with an Exodus team, running Kids Clubs in the main squares in Spanish towns. Given that only about 1% of the population in Spain is Christian, this was a great opportunity for outreach and a great witness to the local community. Sophie had a great time sharing God's love, getting to know the Spanish teams, and seeing the impact of conversations with the families who were involved.

John Doherty

John Doherty was in Uganda with the Hub Church of Ireland and Methodist chaplaincy. During the first week the team of 23 was split in two, John spent the week working in a primary school running a program for the children involving games, songs and bible stories. He also helped to build a new latrine block.

During the second week, he spent the mornings at a remand home, which seeks to rehabilitate young people aged 12-17. Many of them had lived on the streets, and had been convicted of crimes ranging from theft to attempted murder. The team had an opportunity to teach them Bible verses and pray with them.

The afternoons were spent at the Abaana New Life Homes centre, which provides homeless boys with a place to stay and with an education. The team played games, sang songs, taught Bible stories to the boys.




