Celebrating Halloween?

When it comes to Halloween, what are we actually celebrating? Halloween has its roots in a pagan religious festival which began more than 2000 years ago. The Celts, who lived in what is now Ireland, Great Britain and France, believed that on this night, which was their New Year's Eve, the boundary between the worlds of the living and the dead became blurred. There was a very dark side to the celebrations associated with the feast of Samhain (Sow-en), when it was believed that the ghosts/the spirits of the dead returned to earth.

After Christianity came to the region, Pope Gregory, in an attempt to replace the observance of Samhain (Sow-en), moved the Church's Feast of All Saints' Day from the spring to the 1st November, in 835 AD. All Saints' Day was/is a day to thank God for the lives of all his faithful servants. As with most feast days the evening before, 31st October was marked by a sacred vigil in Church and that became known as 'All Hallow's Eve' which in time became shortened to Halloween.

From at least the 16th century, the festival included mumming and guising in Ireland, Scotland, the Isle of Man and Wales. This involved people going from house-to-house in costume (or in disguise), usually reciting verses or songs in exchange for food. Over the years this developed into 'Trick or Treat'.

In more recent times various other practices and customs have become linked to Halloween and it now appears that many of the things associated with Halloween are linked more to pagan beliefs and practices than they are to Christian beliefs and practices.

So, let's be careful what we celebrate and how we celebrate, and if we 'dress up' think about what we are representing or promoting. Let's celebrate God's love for us and the new life we can experience and know through trusting in Jesus Christ. Let's focus our attention on Christ the Light of the World, rather than on the forces of evil and the kingdom of darkness.

From the Rector...

As I was thinking and praying about what to write this month, in which we thank God for the blessings of Harvest, I remembered a story I'd heard about two farmers. They were neighbours, and like other farmers in the area, they were going through tough times.

There had been little rain the previous year, and the harvest had been poor. When it was time to prepare the ground and sow the seed for the coming year the ground was arid and dry. Although, people, including the two farmers, were praying for rain, there was no rain and no indication from the weather forecast that it was going to rain in the near future.

One of the farmers did more than pray, he ploughed and prepared his fields and he sowed the seed. As well as preparing the ground and sowing the seed, he dug a hole where a number of drains came together. When the rain came, it not only watered the seeds enabling them to germinate and grow, some of the excess water ran into the drains and into the hole in the ground, giving the farmer a small reservoir of water for future use.

The two farmers prayed for rain, but only one invested time, energy and money in planting the seed, and he was the one whose land produced a crop for harvest.

Prayer is important, and we must never underestimate the importance of prayer and the power of prayer, particularly, in relation to spiritual growth and development. However, it's not just about praying that we will grow and develop spiritually, it's also about engaging with God as we seek to nurture that growth, and increasingly produce the harvest God wants to see in our lives.

As individuals, it's important that we put our trust in Jesus Christ as our Saviour and live as His followers. If you don't yet know Jesus as your Saviour and friend, then ask Him to forgive your sin and ask Him to come into your life as your Saviour.

When we are followers of Jesus it's important that we know and experience the Holy Spirit at work, transforming our lives, helping us to become more like Jesus, that we invest our time and energy reading and studying the Bible, in prayer and in meeting to worship God, that we invest our time, energy and money in being and becoming the people God wants us to be, and that we live out our faith in daily life, seeking to be witnesses for Him.

It's important that we pray and that we nurture our own spiritual growth and development, but it's also important that we not only pray for numerical and spiritual growth of this Church of which we are a part, but that we invest our time, energy and money in the work and witness of the Church.

Let's be people who pray, who invest our time, energy and money as we seek to nurture our own personal spiritual growth and development and increasingly produce the harvest God wants to see in our lives. In addition to this let be people who invest in the growth and development of the Church and the transformation of the community in which we live.



Vestry Report

Holy Trinity Church - Some parishioners may be aware, there was a break-in at Holy Trinity Church on 14th/15th September. One of the stained-glass windows was damaged, and some panes of clear glass were broken in three other windows, one of the television monitors was damaged. The cost of repairing the damage will be covered by insurance.

Holy Trinity Church Hall - We are awaiting The Executive Office to appoint a contractor for the approved work.

Data Protection - The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) became effective on 25th May 2018. We have been working through these protocols and the Select Vestry would like to thank those groups and organisations for their assistance in the data collection.




