From the Rector...

I'm writing this during the week of amazing sunny weather in September. It's a week in which I saw people lying sun-bathing in the park and even heard a reporter interview people at the seaside.

During that week many of us may have seen or even have got caught behind various types of agricultural equipment, ranging from combine harvesters, to tractors and trailers or tractors with mowers, rakes etc. Farmers and agricultural contractors made the most of the opportunity the good weather provided to make silage and harvest a variety of crops.

As well as harvesting crops some farmers and agricultural contractors have been busy ploughing, preparing the soil and sowing seed for next year's harvest. It's amazing that in the same week crops were being harvested and seed was being sown for next year's harvest.

It's important to remember that although we give thanks to God, at this time of the year, for the blessings of the harvest and for all God provides, the harvesting of crops is an ongoing process; the seed has to be planted

There's pattern and process to having a crop to harvest, that involves sowing, tending and nurturing what has been sown. The same is true in terms of our spiritual growth and development. We won't grow and develop spiritually if we don't allow the seed of God's Word to take root in our lives, if we don't give ourselves to God through trusting in Jesus as our Saviour and then seek to develop and nurture our relationship with Him.

What are we sowing into our lives and through our lives into the lives of others? Are they the things of world or the things of the kingdom of God?

Sow the things of God into your life

I urge you to sow the things of God into your life through daily prayer and Bible reading, through meeting regularly to worship God and through asking and allowing the Holy Spirit to develop and deepen your relationship with God through faith in Christ. Make it your aim to grow and mature as a follower and disciple of Christ.

Let's invest our time, our gifts and abilities, our energy and our resources as we seek to produce a spiritual harvest in our lives and in the lives of others.

Theological Student Placement

Anna Williams, who is currently a second-year student at the Church of Ireland Theological Institute, has started a ten-week placement in the Parish. Anna has been part of the ministry team for a number of years, initially as an intern and more recently has been involved with Youth and Children's Ministry.

Anna will be with us on Sundays and on alternate Fridays, participating in services and in other aspects of the church's life, ministry and mission.

Read the Word

During October, we're reading the Book of Jeremiah. Though Jeremiah was young and felt inadequate to fulfil the task of prophet of the Lord, God speaks to him in Jeremiah 1 and says, "Now I have put my words in your mouth. See, today I appoint you over nations and over kingdoms,



to pluck up and pull down, to destroy and to overthrow, to build and to plant." As Jeremiah responded to the call of God in his life, he would face challenges, danger, and the weight of speaking difficult truths to a people who did not want to listen. God's chosen people had drifted away from God: they refused to listen to His instruction and followed the desires of their own hearts, rather than the way of the Lord. Despite this unfaithfulness, God was willing to remain faithful to the terms of His Covenant with them - they need only pay attention to His words, spoken through Jeremiah, and repent of their sins.

The Book of Jeremiah is challenging to read - with the repeated promises of destruction and judgement - but the challenges are often relevant to our own culture and our own lives, too. As the people of Israel are recalled to God, we are also called to lives of faithfulness. Even as Jeremiah delivers a difficult message, there is also a continued refrain of hope, as we are pointed to Christ, through whom the Kingdom of God will eventually be built and planted.



Bishop Harold's Retirement

Bishop Harold will retire on Monday 30 September after over 22 years as Bishop of Down and Dromore. He laid down his pastoral staff and knelt before the communion at a service in Down Cathedral on Thursday 19 September as his 22 and a half-year ministry as Bishop of Down and Dromore draws to a close.

Invited guests included clergy and representatives from every parish in the diocese and leaders from the major denominations and parachurch organisations as well as politicians and figures from the media and business.

The service was a celebration of faith and ministry and, looking to the future, Bishop Harold invited three young leaders to share the address. Mark Wells, Revd Emma Carson and John McGrath preached in turn and issued a challenge and encouragement to the church based on 1 Timothy 4: 12–16.

After the service, supper was served in a marquee in the cathedral grounds and guests were also treated to a 'This is Your Life' presentation hosted by the BBC's Mark Simpson. Mark looked back over the Bishop's life and ministry with the help of photos, video messages and guests who shared anecdotes and paid tribute to the love, friendship and ministry of Bishop Harold and his wife Liz.

At the end of the evening Bishop Harold and Liz were presented with a gift from the diocese and the bishop, in keeping with tradition, presented the diocese with his portrait which will hang in the See House. Bishop Harold commissioned the oil painting from his artist son, Kevin – the first portrait in the See House to have such a family connection.

Appointment of a new Bishop

The Episcopal Electoral College who have the responsibility of choosing a new Bishop will meet in due course. The Episcopal Electoral College includes the Archbishop of Armagh, two Bishops, 24 representatives from this Diocese and 24 representatives from other Dioceses in the Northern Province of the Church of Ireland.

In a joint statement, the two Deans, the Very Revd Geoff Wilson (Dromore) and the Very Revd Henry Hull (Down) encouraged people to hold the process before God in their prayers:

'It is extremely important that we each commit to praying for those entrusted with this responsibility, that they will be open to the leading of God's Holy Spirit as they undertake their task. There will be a night of prayer in each Cathedral during October, but everyone – even those unable to attend either night – is encouraged to pray every day for this process, in order that God's will should become clear through it."

The nights of prayer will take place in Down Cathedral on Friday 4 October and in Dromore Cathedral on Friday 25 October. Both nights will run from 7:30–9:30pm.

Prayer cards will also be distributed to every worshipping member of the Church of Ireland across the Diocese in the coming weeks.



Joseph Scriven Bicentenary Service

It was a great pleasure to welcome people to the Joseph Scriven Bicentenary Service on Sunday 15th September, and to have a significant number of people in the Church on Saturday as part of the Joseph Scriven Tours. The church was filled to capacity, on the Sunday evening, as people met to worship God and to thank God for Joseph's life.

Joseph was born on 10th September 1819 in Ballymoney Lodge, Banbridge. While studying at Trinity College, Dublin, he heard and responded to the Gospel. Subsequently, he moved to Canada. The hymn 'What a Friend we have in Jesus', written by Joseph Scriven was originally a poem sent to his mother in Ireland.

The Rt. Revd. Henry Scriven, great, great nephew of the late Joseph Scriven was the preacher at the Bicentenary Service. He spoke about Joseph's conversion and the importance of his personal faith which he lived out in daily life, proclaiming the gospel in word and deed. Students from Banbridge Academy, Banbridge High School, St Patricks College, Banbridge, and New-Bridge Integrated College helped to lead the congregational singing of What a Friend we have in Jesus'.

Thank you to all who helped with the preparations for the service, at the service and at the refreshments after the service. Thank you, also, to the Joseph Scriven Bicentenary Committee for the work they did to mark the 200th anniversary of Joseph's birth.




