From the Rector...

It's wonderful when you're invited by family or friends to various events, whether it's a meal, a wedding, a birthday party, an anniversary, or a party just for fun. You feel like you're a part of something, you feel included. However, there are inevitably times when we aren't invited, when we feel excluded and left out, and that can be hurtful.

Even when we are invited to events, we can miss out, because we ignore the invitation, or we put it somewhere safe with the intention of replying later on, but never actually get round to it, or the invitation gets lost in a pile of circulars and letters. Sometimes we suffer from FOMO, Fear Of Missing Out, but at other times we miss out because we say 'no', or because we ignore the invitation or put off replying until

it's too late.

In the Bible, Jesus told a story about a man who invited guests to a party, but the people who were invited made excuses - they were too busy, they had better things to do.



Jesus replied: A certain man was preparing a great banquet and invited many guests. At the time of the banquet he sent his servant to tell those who had been invited, 'Come, for everything is now ready. But they all alike began to make excuses.' The first said, 'I have just bought a field, and I must go and see it. Please excuse me.' Another said, 'I have just bought five yoke of oxen, and I'm on my way to try them out. Please excuse me.' Still another said, 'I just got married, so I can't come.' **Luke14:16-20**

They missed out on a wonderful party. When those who had been invited didn't come, other people were invited and they came to the party - they didn't miss out.

God invites people to be followers of Jesus and to live for Him. God invites us to be part of His family. How have we responded to that invitation? Don't miss out by saying 'no', or ignoring the invitation, or by putting off making a choice.

In that relationship, God invites and encourages us to grow and develop in our faith, to

become more like Jesus, and, in the power of the Holy Spirit, to live out our faith with intentionality and passion. Don't miss out on God's best for you.

You're invited, don't miss out! Invite others, so they don't miss out!




people and parishes of Down and Dromore to bless them and thank them for their many years of service.

Read the Word

During September, we are reading through the book of Isaiah. Isaiah was a prophet, called by God to speak to Israel, and he responds by saying, "Here am I. Send me!" Isaiah announces God's judgement and prepares God's people for the coming of the Servant of the Lord. It's a challenging book, with warnings against sin and passages that



focus on the destructive nature of sin; but it's also a book full of hope and the promise of restoration, as we are pointed to Jesus and the coming of His Kingdom in its fullness.

As you read the Word each day, it might be helpful to follow these four steps:

1. PRAY - ask God, by His Spirit, to open your heart and mind to what he would say to you.

2. READ - don't rush through the passage, but note words or phrases that stand out to you, and read the passage more than once

3. REFLECT - try and understand the passage in its context; then think about the things that have stood out to you, and ask God what he is communicating to you

4. RESPOND - turn to God in prayer and speak to Him about the things that are on your heart and mind. Invite God's Holy Spirit to come, to challenge and change you, so that you live differently because of what you have read.

This year marks the 200th anniversary of the birth of Joseph Scriven, author of the hymn'What a friend we have in Jesus'. Joseph was born at Ballyroney Lodge, Banbridge. A programme of events has been organised to mark the bicentenary of his birth.

These events include:

- a Service on Sunday 15th September at 6:30pm in Holy Trinity Parish Church. Those taking part in the Service will include, the clergy from Banbridge Clergy Fellowship, Bishop Harold Miller, Bishop Henry Scriven (great great nephew of Joseph Scriven) and pupils from local Secondary Schools (Banbridge Academy, Banbridge High, St. Patrick's and New-Bridge Integrated College).
- an exhibition in the local library from 8th-15th September
- free conducted bus trips (kindly sponsored by ABC Council) on Saturday14th September, visiting sites associated with the life of Joseph Scriven, including the house where he was born. Bus trips will leave hourly from Holy Trinity car park and must be booked in advance. Booking can be made from Monday 26th August onwards through the Tourist Board, Old Town Hall, Banbridge (Tel: 028 4062 0232). Pupils from local primary schools (Abercorn, Ballydown, Bridge Integrated, Edenderry, St Mary's and Donard) will be singing 'What a friend we have in Jesus' at the start of each bus trip. Anyone wishing to come along to hear the children sing will be more than welcome.



Making the most of your time

September is the time of year when we get back to a normal routine after the summer. As things get busier again, it's worth considering how we use our time, and asking God how he would have us use the time we are given. Although there are many demands on us, and we don't always get to choose how we spend our time, we can control our attitude towards everything we do – and we can choose to put God first.

How can we use our time wisely?

Firstly, **see time as a gift from God**. Each day is an opportunity to know God better and to serve Him more. Time isn't inexhaustible, as someday our time on earth will end. Psalm 90 says, 'Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom.' Whatever the day holds, we can begin the day by thanking God for the gift of a new day; and we can find peace in God's promise to always be with us.

Secondly, **commit your time to God**. Time is not to be wasted, but to be used for God's glory. We are accountable to God for the way we use our time: 'Be very careful, then, how you live – not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity' (Ephesians 5:15,16). As we commit our time to God, we will want to live each day wisely, acting according to God's will and purposes, and seeking his guidance as we make daily decisions.

Thirdly, **set aside time for God**. How often can we go through a whole day without thinking about God? This is because we relegate God to our spare time, so He ends up at the bottom of our list of priorities. Jesus said, 'Seek first His kingdom and His righteousness' (Matthew 6:33). It is important to set the pattern for the week by coming to church each Sunday to re-focus on God, to re-orient ourselves to the things of His Kingdom, and to re-commit ourselves to following Jesus. Throughout the week, we can set aside time for God by making time for reading the Bible, praying by ourselves and with others, reading books that help us to grow in faith and godliness, and living and working to His praise and glory.

Fourthly, **set aside time for others and ourselves**. If we prioritise our time for God, the rest of life – the things we need to do, the people we need to see, and our own need for rest and relaxation – will fit in their proper place. We are commanded to "love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength" and to "love your neighbour as yourself". We are people made in the image of God, so it is important that we use time to care for ourselves and for other people, demonstrating Christ's love for others by the way we love them.
